





 - Upcoming, 2024







Phase I: Historic Context Statement (Completed)

- Historic context statement and historic resources survey inform each other
- Historic context provides the framework for evaluating the potential significance of properties and neighborhoods

 Provides understanding of built resources according to overall development patterns in the City





Phase II: Citywide Historic Resources Survey

- A historic resources survey is a planning tool that is used to identify, evaluate, and document historically significant properties
- Survey based on current best practices and guidance from the National Park Service and California Office of Historic Preservation
- Based on identified development patterns and other themes
- Properties evaluated for potential significance and historic integrity (ability to convey significance)
- Does *not* result in the formal designation, which is a separate, public process





Benefits of a Citywide Survey


A historic resources survey identifies potential historic resources to provide clarity for property owners; aid in future planning efforts; and help preserve the City's historic character and identity. A survey assists:

 - Affordable Housing & Adaptive Reuse


Survey Workplan

- Review existing studies, surveys, and literature
- Prepare database and maps
- Preliminary reconnaissance of all 19,000+ parcels
- Research on potentially eligible properties to confirm construction dates, architects, builders




Survey Workplan

- All fieldwork conducted from the public right-of-way
- Field documentation collected in project database
- Document architectural styles, character-defining features, alterations of eligible properties
- Digital photographs of eligible and ineligible properties



Initial Draft Findings: Overview

- 345 properties appear individually eligible;
- Potential adoption of survey findings pending development of a local **ordinance** in the next phase





Final Survey Deliverables

- Survey Report
 - Description of study area and period of study
 - Documentation of project methodology
 - Recommendations for future study
 - Maps
 - Master property spreadsheet
 - DPR Forms for eligible properties




Project Timeline: Phase II (Survey)

Date	Task
January – February 2023	 Reconnaissance survey of all City parcels to identify properties for evaluation
March – April 2023	Prepare draft recommendations
May – June 2023	 Intensive survey fieldwork and evaluation of selected properties
July 2023	Prepare survey documentation (DPR Forms)
August – September 2023	Prepare draft survey report and survey findings
September – October 2023	 City Council and Community Meeting: Discuss draft survey report and findings Finalize survey report and findings
